
Pour yourself a tippie (just the one, mind), settle back and enjoy the fruits of someone else's labours.





Weight Watchers will meet at 7 PM at the First Presbyterian Church. Please use large double door at the side entrance.








THE QUARANTINE CYCLE




WHY I WEAR HEADPHONES AT WORK




RELATIONSHIPS: BEFORE & AFTER WORKING FROM HOME
