

Fabulous Flowers



Alliums

The ornamental onion, from Central Asia.

Alliums come in a wide range of sizes from small to very large. They do have a very oniony smell as the part of the onion family.

With their large globe flowers, and straight stems they can make quite a statement in the garden. Each head is made up of many star like shaped flowers. As the flower ages, the star like flowers will turn to green seed heads. The most popular colour is purple but they come in pink, blue and white.

If you are buying alliums then make sure the flowers are not crushed or drooping, and the stems are strong.

It makes an ideal flower to use in tall designs, and is often used in contemporary work. They last in a vase for up to two weeks, if the water is changed every two to three days. They are sensitive to bacteria.

They are easy to grow in the garden, in a well drained soil in full sun. Plant the bulbs in the autumn to flower in the late spring, early summer.

In the language of flowers the Allium is a symbol of prosperity.

Judging

Back in 1974, (almost prehistoric times!) as a

keen flower arranger with very young children I was studying on a City & Guilds Flower Arrangement Course when I was persuaded by my tutor to take an Area Judges Test in our local Area of Wessex & Jersey.

I was so fortunate that the Judging Instructor was the excellent Anne Jennings who still is so highly regarded in her own Area and by NAFAS. In those days having passed this Test, all newly qualified judges were able to gain experience and knowledge very quickly due to the large number of Shows and Competitions that took place – almost every Flower Club had a monthly competition and a big Annual

Show, also the Horticultural Societies were very active with their Shows usually including classes for flower arrangements.

My husband was attached to the Armed

Services and was frequently posted to different parts of the UK and abroad so we had many moves over the following years before finally coming to Sussex in 1986. This was when I took the opportunity of sitting and passing the National Judges Test in 1987. By then there were not so many local Shows to judge but now being nationally qualified meant that I could go further afield and judge Area Shows throughout the UK and also to be on the judging panel for the NAFAS National Show.

In 1991 I was asked to join the National Judging



Committee of NAFAS and from then on things started to became even more interesting. I decided to take further training and became a

Judging Adjudicator officiating at Area Judges Tests throughout the country, even becoming one of the examiners at the National Judges Tests a few times. In due course I became the Chairman of the National Judging Committee which was one of the most enjoyable committee experiences of my whole NAFAS 'career'. As Chairman, one becomes the Arbitrator at NAFAS National Shows and my first assignment was as the Arbitrator for the wonderful "Far Pavilions" NAFAS National Show held at the Brighton Centre in 1994 when the work of the Sussex competitors and organisers resulted in this being one of

the best National Shows ever.

By now I was starting to become involved in international judging and attended courses and seminars in both Belgium and France (although

my schoolgirl French was sorely tried and tested during those days) culminating in judging at an international Show at Toulouse in France. It was however at the peak of all this in 1996 that I was selected to go to New Zealand and represent the UK on the judging panel of the WAFA Show there, which was a wonderful experience. It was while I was judging this Show in New Zealand that I was approached by the president of the Flower Arranging movement of Uruguay to go to Montevideo to judge at an International show there

alongside the flower arranging judges from the USA and to follow this by going on to take a Judges' Training session for a group of interested ladies in Buenos Aires in Argentina (luckily they all spoke English!!)

Although my visits to New Zealand and South America were unbelievably exciting, there was more to come. In 2002 the UK hosted the biggest and best WAFA World Show in Glasgow and many of our Area members attended this fantastic event. The WAFA President at the time, Moira MacFarlane asked me to be the Chairman of Judges and Arbitrator for this show which was such a great honour. It was an enormous show and we had 32 International Judges from all the WAFA member countries.

On judging day it all went like clockwork with the judges, their stewards and interpreters all working so well together and in good time for our royal guest HRH Princess Anne to arrive to open the event.

On being presented to her as the Arbitrator for the Show she was so intrigued to learn if I had to break up any difficult arguments with all these different nationalities


Much as I enjoyed my time and role at the WAFA Show in Glasgow it was really the

beginning of the end of my involvement with international judging. Although in 2008 I was asked by the Pakistan WAFA President to go to Lahore to be the Judging Arbitrator at their WAFA Show, but sadly this was not to be -during the planning and lead-up to the Show the Pakistan political figure Benazir Bhutto was assassinated and the whole country was so dangerous and in such an uproar that the whole Show was cancelled which was a disappointment to all concerned.

However time moves on and other aspects of my life of flower arranging have taken their place, although it is still so exciting to be a judge at one of the large agricultural shows around the country. There is also the joy of being able to pass on the benefit of one's experience and knowledge to others who are starting off on their judging path, so it gave me great pleasure be able to assist in the training of our own Sussex Area Judges in 2019 when we had a splendid number of passes in the Area Tests. Weren't we lucky to have all this training completed before the world went Covid-crazy in the following year?

How

create a
Facebook
Page for
your club

Facebook is about regular activity and communication - promotion of events, news, workshops, demonstrations.

Anyone can create a Page, but only official representatives can create a Page for an organisation, business, brand or public figure.

You and fellow administrators will need to have their own personal Facebook account, and you will need their email addresses.

First things to consider:

- Club Details name, generic email address, venue address and postcode, dates and times, information about the club and programme of events.
- Administrators two to three people who will manage the page, upload photos, advertise events, respond to messages, and generally keep it up to date.
- Generic Email set up an email on a site like gmail, Yahoo, Aol etc
 e.g downsflowerclub@gmail.com

1. To create a Club Page:

Go to facebook.com/pages/create

Facebook has six options to choose from:

- · local business or place,
- company/organisation/institution,
- brand or product,
- artists/band/public figure,
- entertainment, or
- cause/community.

If you choose cause/community, you will be creating a more informal page.



Click to choose a Page type - and choose - Nonprofit organisation You will be taken through a wizard to set up the page.

2. What you will need to enter for the initial set up:

About information you need to enter:

- Club name e.g. the Downs Flower Club
- Meeting address and the postcode it creates a map e.g. the Village Hall, High Street, Town,
- A short description of what you do e.g. we meet every first Tuesday of the month at 3pm to see floral demonstrations, run workshops etc
- Contact phone number e.g. the Chairman's or Secretary's
- Email address a generic email e.g <u>downsflowerclub@gmail.com</u>
- Custom URL choose a custom URL for your page, so people can visit www.facebook.com/yourclubname rather than www.facebook.com/ 1193931992341, or whatever set of numbers they assign to your account.

3. Publish the Club Page

- Set up the Administrators of the club page (Settings>Page>Role)
- Add Profile Picture (logo) and cover (banner) photos
- Invite your Facebook friends to 'Like' the page.
- Posting ability set this to 'anyone can publish to the page', this will

allow your followers to make comments. If adverse comments are received you can deal with this by disabling or blocking them.

 Add Milestones, these are significant events in the history of your club that get banners and descriptions in your news feed.

4. Keeping the Club Page up to date

- Aim to post 2-3 times a week
- 'Like' / 'Follow' other pages
- Comment, like and respond
- Use images when you post, they are more eye catching and memorable
- Let people know you have a Facebook page
- Publicise events, share them with your friends and ask them to share with their friends and to other pages e.g. the village chat page or similar.
- You can pay for a Boost post this costs money to advertise, it may target specific groups in particular areas.

Remember - NAFAS policy – you *must seek permission* from the designer, demonstrator and event organiser prior to posting images of their work. Demonstrators are not keen on having all their designs made public. They may be happy for a photo of one design to be posted, but you must ask, and credit them.

The more activity there is on your page, the greater the level of interest.

Let us know when you have set up your page.
