Our demonstrations were of 1950's, 60's and 70's and one contemporary arrangement. June Kearsley our competitions secretary started off with a triangle arrangement representing the 1950's using Julia Clement's style. Traditional plant material as we would have had then was used. She looked just the part in her blue and white spotted dress and sporting a 50's hairdo tied up with a red spotted scarf. Gill Davey moved us on into the 60's Flower Power representing the use of brighter colours in her arrangement. Caroline

Griggs in a splendid ABBA disco outfit represented the 1970's with a colourful vertical arrangement of gerberas and gentians. The final contemporary arrangement was done by Annette Quelch showing the use of structures,

Back in May we visited the National Flower Show at Hylands House in Chelmsford, Essex organised annually, it is essentially a garden




show, however there is a floral exhibition in the big house.

We have visited the show several times, and this year it had returned virtually to pre covid times, so plenty to see, do and purchase.




It was a lovely floral show organised by Mig Kimpton, as each of the ground floor rooms follow the theme. This year it was 'Alice in Wonderland'.

Winning Ways Competition Workshop with Dr Christina D Curtis

This day was a wow experience for all who took part.

It was very pleasing to be able to offer this subsidised learning experience to so many of our members. A large proportion of the attendees had not



entered a floral competition and we had very comprehensive, insightful guidance on how to proceed and also encouragement and help towards taking the plunge and becoming a competitor.

Christina, our excellent

and experienced tutor, welcomed questions and was very generous with her time and knowledge and went to great lengths to explain all the details in her answers.

Many different styles of competition work were shown. The NAFAS competition manual was highlighted, explaining the definitions of styles of exhibits.

We were shown many examples of traditional and contemporary work including small scale designs. These can be seen in the pictures



displayed on the stage with the stage curtains behind. We learnt about craft definitions and plant material in all its forms, in accordance with NAFAS competitions guidelines.

As this was also a practical day, everyone made an arrangement as if they were taking part in a competition, with space and drapes allotted for each participant to set up their arrangement.

All participants were asked to make a "Summer Basket", an exhibit to be displayed within a given space. This produced a huge variety of finished designs as can be seen from the pictures.

A handout was also given to the participants, which was a very helpful aide memoire for future reference. This day was a great success, and we were able to give

everyone a place that applied for one.

FOAM FREE

Following on from an excellent workshop I attended with Dr Christina Curtis, I was asked to pen a short article regarding the mechanics I used. We were asked to produce a 'Summer Basket' arrangement for judging purposes, so I decided to try and go foam free.

Inspired by Gill McGregor in her book entitled 'How to - go greener floral foam free' I tackled the aluminium wire domed circle, which I secured to a vase and then placed in the basket.

She also used a pin holder, but I adapted and made two circles which I wired together to form a cushion.

So take a coil of aluminium wire and make a circle the circumference of the container you are going to use. Twist the wire around the circle for a second time to make it stronger. Do not cut the wire off. Take a large test tube and wind the wire around it to form a circle, slip the circle off and make a second one twisting in the opposite direction. Continue until you have enough circles to fill the space. Cut off and secure.


Then take some bullion wire and just secure some of the circles together at the edges if needed. Push up into a dome. I then made a second one and wired them together to form the cushion. As I was not using a pin holder it gave extra stability when placing the plant material in the vase.


I found the wire very easy to work with and not so severe on the hands as wire mesh or chicken wire.

It was very successful so do have a go.

Gill presented Chrissie with the 'Jubilee' arrangement as you can see from the attached photo. Chrissie said that it absolutely made her

We stayed to the end of the show, caught the launch up stream to the railway station for our homeward journey, clutching all the goodies we purchased along with the beautiful floral design that Chrissie won.
