





The Sussex Area arranged flowers at Westminster Abbey on four occasions during my term of office. In addition, I was honoured to be invited to arrange a pedestal for our late monarch's state funeral service.

Five of our members represented the National Association at the RHS Chelsea Flower Show in 2021, achieving a gold medal. This show had such broad coverage in print, TV and online that I'm sure the appeal of our art form has been widened.


At Area level, we have achieved so much. Did we let lock-down (or should that be knock-down?) hold us back? A resounding no! We learnt how to Zoom. Who would have thought that in an Area which has approximately 25% of its members without the internet, we would have flourished? Well, flourish we did. With a

buddy system for those who weren't online, clubs ensured that everyone had access to information from HQ, the Area and at club level. Sussex Area Council allowed us to offer Area events to non members which gives us the opportunity to reach out to members of the public to advance awareness and education in the art of flower arranging, helping to fulfil our charitable remit.

We resurrected and produced the Area Newsletter, which during lockdown, was weekly. What a stroke of luck for us that the delightful Duncan Ward volunteered to take over as Editor of this newsletter. The plan was a monthly edition moving to a quarterly production as we returned to normal life (Sssshhh – I think he's forgotten and has stuck to monthly!). The newsletter goes from strength to strength, and if you haven't seen the recent phenomenal photobook of Sense of Place, you absolutely must check it out. Again, it's available on the website. I'm very grateful to Duncan for everything he's done for us.

I'm also grateful to the JDS&E committee in all their configurations. They too rose to the challenge and met virtually. Education

continued with the Level 2ers, beginners and follow-on classes, Area workshops, first aid and trainer training workshops.

I'd like to thank the Executive Committee as well who were outstanding in their attempts to keep calm and carry on. We organised Zoom Council meetings, a virtual Club Officer week, Club Chairmen's Forums, as well as virtual Area Days until we could meet again. We started our strategy meetings, which doubled our workload, discussing scenarios for various eventualities, their repercussions, risks and opportunities for the Sussex Area. Behind the scenes, we improved governance by introducing trustee induction packs and a comprehensive set of standing orders underpinning our constitution, which has also been reviewed during my term of office.

Last year we celebrated the Sussex Area's 60th anniversary with an outdoor flower festival Flower Power held at Leonardslee Lakes & Gardens. Two years in the planning by the hard-working committee, this show gave our members the opportunity to display their skills in floral art to thousands of members of the general public as well as the social benefit of meeting up with each other for the first time in eighteen months.

This year has seen the delayed *Sense of Place* at Lancing College Chapel. A fantastic, contemporary, flower festival which has received rave reviews. What a feat for Linda Porrett's design team and the committee. This

Chichester Flower Festival 2016

Members of East Preston
Floral Club have helped at
Chichester Cathedral Flower
Festival for over 20 years,
however in 2016 the overall
title of the festival title was
"Artistic Pallette" and we were
asked to interpret
"Remembrance" in
St. Georges Chapel which is
the memorial chapel for the
Royal Sussex Regiment.



colour representing the "poppies", and their shape depicting the hearts of the lost heroic soldiers.

We covered the columns throughout the Chapel with split carpet tubes covered in gold sprayed leaves with individual anthuriums placed on them. At ground floor level we painted flower box lids black with wet floral foam underneath, then stood the red anthurium soldiers in rows as if on parade.

Three plaques were made in dried plant material and placed around the Chapel, one showing the Royal Sussex Regimental badge, another depicting the Royal British Legion and the last written in gold, the John McCrae poem "In Flanders Fields", (our local church now has these for exhibiting in November on Remembrance Day).



The artists we were depicting were Tom Piper and Paul Cummins noted for their design of the poppies - "Blood Swept Lands and Seas of Red" at the Tower of London.

As poppies are a short lived cut flower, and to achieve the best representation, we selected to use "*Tropical*" anthuriums - their scarlet



The main display was managed by manipulating a vast amount of chicken wire around one whole side of the Chapel, then fixing it to the decorative ironwork. It was then manually pushed around to form undulations around columns etc., in order to represent the formation of artists' design in the moat at the Tower.

An enormous amount of anthuriums were then all put individually into tubes of water and hung through the chicken wire thus giving the overall effect the waves of red poppies imitating the design in London.
