The clean lines, the soft stone colours of the pillars and the contemporary glass doors inspire a simple design here, allowing the visitors a clear view of this wonderful and long-awaited final addition to the chapel.




#### Narthax



The colours and shapes of the beautifully ornate ceiling in this welcome area of the chapel has inspired this design. The tailored shapes are repeated down and around the columns and colourful pedestal designs complement this pavé design.

#### Nave

The 10 circular platforms created in this serpentine shaped design suggests the winding river Adur below the east side of the chapel and echo the shapes in the Rose window to the west.

The nave stretches 10 bays, overlooked by the window which was designed by Stephen Dykes-Bower. Completed in 1977 it is the largest Rose window in England, being 32 feet in diameter, and made up of 30,000 pieces of glass.


The botanical story aims to reflect the English landscape using predominantly British flowers, chosen to pick up the colours of the window.

#### Music Stands








#### **Organ Choir Book**

This organ made by the Danish company Th. Frobenius and installed in 1986 has inspired us to create an oversized music book with flying notes from the book to the pipes creating a visual picture of the organ being played.







#### **Choir Stalls**







Music and Drama are the inspiration for this area. These departments play an important part of the school curriculum. Drama was introduced at the college in 1862 and the Musical Society was formed in 1877.

The designs in this area, including the organ and the choir stalls, has roots in the college music and drama departments. Regular performances take place in the outdoor theatre in the college grounds which Is surrounded by trees and grassy banks. The theatre was opened by Agatha Christie in 1960 and the altar area represents this with its musical performances, and the annual summertime show.

Decorated double bass structures interpret a part of the orchestra.







### Walker Organ Gallery








The chantries to the aisle sides of the choir area commemorate the founders, Revd Nathanial Woodard and his son, Billy Woodard.

White lilies are traditionally used in these areas and echo the carvings on the organ.

The large Oak leaves echo the oak leaves in the decoration of the Organ.



#### South Entrance



#### Crypt

In 1875 the crypt was the first area to be consecrated. It is a part of the chapel that has had many uses in the past. From worship to the art school, to the music department, this area is a reflection of all the activities and craft that has been produced, and is a general hive of activity. The senses play a large part of the decorations here celebrating sights and sounds of daily life.

The inspiration for this design comes from the black and white Harlequin floor decoration in the All Souls chapel, seen to the right as you enter the crypt through the cloister door. There are African and Sicilian marbles and an alabaster reredos. This small chapel commemorates the founder, Nathaniel Woodard. South African flowers are used here, a reference to the marble floor.

#### Altar



The students gathered here for worship before the main part of the chapel was completed and this has inspired a design that circulates the altar to capture the mood of students and teachers gathering there.











A decorative design continues in the main area of the crypt.

This long bookcase demanded a wide design to interpret the open vista of the sea between Shoreham and Lancing. It was here in the 1870's that a ship was wrecked in the stormy sea by Shoreham harbour. It contained a cargo of Portland stone and was salvaged by Billy Woodard on his barge and later used in the Nave

Throughout this area the arrangements feature sound, smell, taste and texture.




























The foundation stone of the cloister was laid in 1921 as a tribute to the veterans of the First World War has inspired a peaceful design in this area of the chapel. Stone seats along the south wall with the rose garden beyond invite contemplation.

The design here provides a link between the Sussex landscape and the arrangements in the chapel. Simple undulating shapes link each bay resembling a stylised meadow with the windows capturing roadside hedges and gardens. Organic Willow structures compliment the floral installation and Origami cranes fly overhead, representing hope and healing.


