Council Meetings

These meetings are held quarterly – usually in February, May, August and November

The Area Council consists of:

- Area Chairman
- Area Vice Chairman
- Area Secretary
- Area Treasurer
- Programme Administrator
- Ticket Administrator
- Media Administrator
- Chairman JDS&E (Judges, Demonstrators, Speakers and Education) and
- Club Delegates

There are several specialist administrators appointed who report to members of the Executive as appropriate.

Each Member Club appoints a delegate to serve on the Area Council.

A delegate:

- Votes on behalf of their club at Council meetings
- Reports to their club on Area matters
- Cannot be a member of the Executive Committee of the Area
- Normally serves for no more than three consecutive years

If the delegate is unable to attend a meeting, a deputy or proxy can be appointed by the Club to attend with full voting rights. If the deputy or proxy is unable to attend, the Club may register with the Area Secretary for a postal or email vote. This vote must be received by the Area Secretary no later than 48 hours before the Meeting.

Any affiliated club member is entitled to attend Council meetings but may not vote.

Any affiliated club member is entitled to receive the minutes of Council meetings upon application to the Area Secretary.

All members are very welcome to attend Council meetings.



The Annual General Meeting

Financial year is 1 October to 30 September

- Takes place by 25 November
- Each member club has one vote
- Any affiliated club member of the Sussex Area may attend the AGM but may not vote unless they are the official club delegate.
- The AGM is chaired by the Area President. Serving a three-year term, the President is chosen by the Executive, a member is chosen for the commitment, involvement and support to the Area over the years. The President attends the last Council meeting of the year.
- The Vice President is chosen one year ahead of becoming President.

Area Days

Area Days are one way of sharing fun, friendship and flowers across the Sussex Area membership and to showcase our floral art to members and non-members alike.

These are held three times a year – usually in March, June and October.

Chairmen's Forum

These are held twice a year, usually in the Spring and Autumn, giving all clubs an opportunity of discussing matters of mutual interest with their peers as well as the Area Officers.

passionate about only using bio degradable materials and not using Oasis. All of his foliage came from the Hospice garden and he had a fantastic variety of greenery including




